SCYTHS WELCOMES NEW INTERIM PRINCIPAL


Principal's

Several of the objectives I am currently working on include: communication with the school community, improving attendance, filling vacancies with quality candidates and supporting students, parents, faculty and staff.



As part of their American Spirit SkillsUSA project, Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School Academy for Health & Medical Sciences freshman Aarush Kumar of Hillsborough, Milan Patel of Franklin Park and Jiya Mody of Martinsville coordinated a panel discussion with a variety of medical doctors for students interested in pursuing careers in medical fields.

Attending the panel were a family physician, a cardiologist and doctors practicing hospital medicine. The panel discussion allowed for students from the SCVTHS Academy for Health & Medical Sciences and Health Occupations classes to ask questions and hear about their

experiences. The doctors spoke of what drew each of them to the field, why they chose to pursue a career in medicine, how new technology affects their jobs, as well as other life choices and hardships they have experienced. Additionally, each of the doctors spoke of their individual passion as being the main driver in what made them decide to pursue their medical
