Pratima Patil, a science instructor at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School, has been selected as the 2015-2016 Educator of the Year. Ms. Patil is known for being a giving, dedicated, and selfless instructor, who always puts the students first.

When Superintendent Dr. Chrys Harttraft and Principal Diane Ziegler walked into Ms. Patil's classroom to announce the award, Patil was very surprised, "I was thrilled," said Patil. "The kids were also very excited." After sharing the announcement with some of her family and parents in India, Patil has been receiving countless calls congratulating her on the honor.

Patil graduated with bachelor's the University of Bombay (currently

the University of Mumbai). Since her graduation, Ms. Patil has served as a professor at the University of Bombay and for the past ten years as a science instructor at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School. Patil also serves as an adjunct professor for Raritan Valley Community College, teaching SCVTHS students college level science courses. When asked what inspired her to become an educator, Ms. Patil stated, "I have a long history of educators in my family. My grandfather was a renowned Zoologist in India and my uncle was a professor at Boston University."

Beyond the classroom, Ms. Patil is involved as a SkillsUSA advisor and the advisor for the Science League at SCVTHS. Patil has also served as the school's advisor of the Bio Olympiad and NJ Envirothon. "I am thrilled to work with the students and encourage them in every way that I can. I love to challenge the students
