
ERIK FARGO SELECTED AS SCYTHS EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR

The NJ STARS Program, created by the State of New Jersey, provides New Jersey's highest achieving students with free tuition to their home county college. The award "covers the cost of tuition, less any State and/or Federal grants and scholarships, for up to five semesters and covers up to 18 credit hours per semester. Funding for NJ STARS awards is dependent upon annual State appropriations."
