At the 55th Annual SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference (NLSC), held in Louisville, Kentucky from June 24-28, 2019, students from Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School earned a total of 19 medals, including 17 Gold. The 19 medals are the most SCVTHS has ever won at a national competition. Additionally, the state of New Jersey finished with an all-time number of 57 medals. New Jersey SkillsUSA State Director Peter Carey commented, "New Jersey SkillsUSA smashed all previous state records for national medals, and our total of 57 medals was the 3rd highest in the country. It's a credit to the advisors and instructors who worked very hard to prepare the New Jersey competitors. Everyone associated with our organization should be extremely proud.\*

#### **SCYTHS INSTRUCTOR RECEIVES THE NEW JERSEY 2019 AMERICAN LEGION EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD**

On June 13th, Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School (SCVTHS) Social Studies Instructor Ed Graf was presented with The American Legion, Department of New Jersey's 2019 "Educator of the Year" Award at the 101st Annual State Convention in Wildwood, New Jersey.
