On April 6, 2018, five students from the Academy for Health and Medical Sciences and one instructor at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School (SCVTHS) received awards while attending the 2018 Committee of Teaching About the United Nations (CTAUN) Conference, "Stepping Up to Protect the World's Children" at the United Nations headquarters in New York City.

The five students, who attend both SCVTHS and Raritan Valley Community College, had their posters selected out of hundreds submitted by college and university students in the annual contest promoting the theme of this year's Conference. The students who were selected are Catherine Chen of Warren, Sandra Raju of Hillsborough, Matthew Natividad of Somerset, Rahul Ubriani of Somerset, and Julia Garaffa of Skillman. The students presented their posters and received their certificates in front of more than 500 attendees at the Conference.

SCVTHS Spanish Instructor Guillermo Reina was one of six educators to be selected as a recipient of the 2018 Excellence in Education Award at the Conference. Mr. Reina was selected for his leadership of a global project entitled, "Developing Global Awareness on Health Issues in Indigenous Regions of Latin America." Mr. Reina, his

students and the non-profit organization DB Perú used the guidelines from the Asia Society and its Global Competence model to develop their project. DB Perú is a non-profit organization with a goal to bring sustainable healthcare and education to the communities of the Napo River in Perú.

"We were the only high school from New Jersey selected from dozens of applicants. We are very proud of the amazing work our students did and that our school was recognized in front of hundreds of scholars, university faculty, college students and leaders from UNESCO, UNICEF and the United Nations," said Mr. Reina.*

First Place Winner - Newsletter Category

U.S. News & World Report and the North Carolinabased RTI International has recently ranked Somerset Vocational & Technical High School among the best high schools in the United States. In total, the U.S. News & World Report analyzed over 20,500 public high schools in the nation, and ranked nearly 6,000 of the highest-scoring schools as Gold, Silver or Bronze. Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School was selected along with 3,237 other high schools as Bronze medal winners.

According to U.S. News, the selection was based on the key principles that a great high school must serve all of its students well, not just those who are college-bound. In addition, the high school must be able to produce measurable academic outcomes to show that it is successfully educating its student body across a range of performance indicators.

Somerset County Vocational & Technical Schools Superintendent Dr. Chrys Harttraft spoke of the ranking by saying, "We are proud of our Bronze level designation. It is a testament to our hard-working students, teachers and staff. The Bronze award recognizes achievements of a diverse group of students, the excellent preparation of all of their sending districts in the County, as well as their success in Career and Technical Education. Our instruction does not include AP courses and therefore we are not considered for the Silver or Gold awards. However, we do value our partnerships with two and four year colleges, allowing many of our students to accumulate between 3 and 64 college credits during their tenure at SCVTHS," stated Dr. Harttraft.

SCVTH Principal Diane Ziegler added, "At our school, we have eighteen programs we offer to students

in grades 9-12. Within our course offerings, students and families have many options when choosing to attend our school, and we are able to provide extra assistance or enrichment working on a small group or individual basis. Receiving award recognition such as this is validation that our programs and our teachers are providing students a diverse education and preparing them for college, career or both."*
