Old or Unfinished Business

• Mr. Jones introduced and acknowledged the SkillsUSA state medal winners and advisors. These students will be participating at the national competition in Kansas City on June 22-27, 2009.

Student of the Month

• Anna Isachenko, a second year student in the Health & Medical Sciences Academy, was selected as the Student of the Month for May. She was recognized recently in the NJ SkillsUSA Championships where she won a silver medal with her team members in the Tech Prep Human Services competition and Closing Ceremony presentation. Born in Moscow, Anna and her family settled in Manville. Her love of music and singing helped her win a High Honors Award for vocal performance from the Westminster Conservatory of Music. Her other interests include piano, soccer and photography. She was a member of a traveling soccer team in Middlesex, and now participates in the Photography Club and Peer Leadership Club at SCVTHS. She finds time to attend the new Emergency Medical Technician class at SCVTHS that meets after school hours. She is attending Raritan Valley Community College for an Introduction to Music class. After she graduates she intends to continue her education in a field of her choice.

Administrative Action Plans

- Mrs. Brink reported on further actions of the Make a Difference campaign. A clinician has gone into classrooms to speak with students; anti-bullying videos are available for use in classrooms; weekly anti-bullying meetings and a "wall of peace" have been created.
- Mr. Carey presented an update on the career tech and high school redesign.
- Mrs. Ziegler discussed that she is working to meet the State's Average Yearly Progress requirements by improving the language arts literacy and math scores and that this is an on-going effort. Next she will begin to prepare the New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum "plan" and prepare to begin the process. Mrs. Ziegler will be forwarding updated curriculum to the board for approval.
- Mr. Herrera updated the board on "where literacy finds meaning" professional development opportunity with "MAX" teaching and reading strategies that will increase and improve literacy among students in their career major areas.
- Dr. Petrosino updated the board on Project Explore and the online software Project Foundry which allows a student to work on the project in an unlimited, unrestricted time frame. Mr. Maddaluna is hoping to offer this to 20 students who are interested.
- Mr. Wallace reported on the "Plan of Action for Technology" which includes networking among tech professionals; reviewing Promedia recommendations; improving internet connectivity; updating district forms and understanding administrative needs. Mrs. Strober commented on how Mr. Wallace, without much time to prepare, was charged with not only immediately securing our infrastructure as a result of an unexpected retirement but also managing the reorganization of the technology department. He is gaining the respect and trust of the technology staff; he is attending professional development opportunities on various aspects of his new position; and he is participating in monthly administrative council meetings. Mrs. Strober is pleased on how well Mr. Wallace is performing his new responsibilities. She is looking forward to his continued growth and the future successes of the department and within the district.

C. County Tax Resolution

Mrs. Strober brought to the board's attention that the above represents a significant reduction in county funding. The current monthly amount for the 2008-2009 school year that the district receives from the freeholders is \$1,026,214. As you can see from the resolution above that for the first six months of the 2009-2010 school year, the amount to be received is less than prior year by over \$100,000 each month. Mrs. Strober noted this will immediately affect the district's monthly cash flow. She also brought to the board's attention that even though the second six months of the 2009-2010 school year is greater than the first six months, the amount is still less than the prior school year's funding amount.
