Reorganization Meeting November 1, 2010 5:00 p.m.

The New Jersey Statutes Annotated 18A stated under 18A:54-18 that the County Vocational Boards of Education shall organize annually on November 1st by the election of a President and Vice President, unless November 1st shall fall on a Sunday, in which case the board shall organize the following day. The law was amended in 1970 and became effective December 3, 1970, by adding the following: If the organization meeting cannot take place on the day hereinabove provided for by reason of a lack of a quorum or for any other reason, said meeting shall be held within three days thereafter.

Diane Strober, Assistant Superintendent for Business/Board Secretary called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. with the following board members present:

Adequate notice of this meeting has been provided specifying time and place.

Pledge of Allegiance

At this time Dr. Braun asked if he could address the board as his statements are relative to the reorganization to the board. First, he felt that it is important to inform the board that two weeks ago he was asked to relinquish/step down as president of the board by Freeholder Director and Board Liaison Jack Ciattarelli. Mr. Ciattarelli's perspective is that of a Freeholder in which a Freeholder is assigned each year to the position of Director on a rotating basis. Dr. Braun's perspective is that of a school board member in which the President is nominated by the other board members each year and can hold the position for more than one consecutive year. With that being said, Dr. Braun noted that he felt his role as President and Vice President were successful in terms of appointing key personnel, and improving and expanding programs and upgrading facilities. Additionally, last week, Dr. Braun suffered the loss of a close family member and was extensively involved with the arrangements until this past Saturday night which was when Mr. Ciattarelli sent an e-mail to all board members with regard to the above. At this point Dr. Braun made an official statement that he was stepping down as President.

"It has been my distinct honor and privilege to serve as President for the past two years and Vice-President for more than 25 years before that. In that time we have overseen many positive changes in the school I have two more years left in my term on the board and high expectations for the future of this school, but I stand before you today to let you know that I am stepping down as President and will not be running for re-election tonight. In dealing with the search for a new Superintendent, I feel that it would be to the benefit of the board and the school that I step down from the Presidency. I had hoped to end my time on the Board as President, but now is truly the best time to step down. The transition period requires a very close working relationship with the new Superintendent and the new President, by necessity, will have to be activity engaged over at least the first year with the new person selected to effect a lasting relationship for the success of that job and for the welfare of the school – its students, faculty and administration. For me, this would limit my direct capability to work very closely with the new Superintendent. It is better,

therefore, at this time of reorganization, to allow a new President a long effective working time than I would be able to give if I continued as President. I pledge to continue as an active board member and I challenge this board to remain responsive to the needs of the school, responsible to the fact that this is an autonomous board and to make only our objective decisions for the good of the school in the selection of a new Superintendent as well as in the difficult areas of budget and negotiations that will surely come. Thank you."

Mrs. Doyle said that she was sorry to hear of Dr. Braun's loss. Mr. Smith stated that he too was sorry for Dr. Braun's loss and was sorry for the shabby way Dr. Braun had been treated. Mr. Smith thought there was a more professional way to have handled this. Mr. Smith said he was offended by parts of the e-mail Dr. Braun referenced. Mr. Smith complimented Dr. Braun on the excellent job he did searching and hiring key administrators and also acknowledged the other marvelous changes under Dr. Braun's Presidency with regard to programs and facilities. Mr. Smith stated he was proud to serve on this board with Dr. Braun.

A. Board of Education President

The Board Secretary asked for nominations for the position of President.

On motion by Mrs. Doyle, seconded by Mr. Dudeck, Mr. Hyncik was nominated for the position of President. Mr. Hyncik accepted.

Mrs. Strober asked for other nominations. There were none.

On motion by Dr. Braun, seconded by Mrs. Doyle, the nominations for President were closed and a roll call vote for Mr. Hyncik as President was taken.

Mr. Hyncik expressed his sorrow to Dr. Braun on the death of his uncle. He also asked Dr. Braun to continue to stay engaged in board matters as his knowledge is invaluable. Mr. Hyncik also noted his appreciation for Mrs. Doyle's contributions in terms of guiding the district through the changing Department of Education laws and regulations; Mr. Smith's contribution in terms of leadership and years in education; and Mr. Dudeck's contributions in terms of vocational education. Mr. Hyncik also reported that the committee appointments will remain intact; although one of the committees may be revisited.

Mr. Hyncik assumed the President's chair and called for nominations for the position of Vice President. On motion by Dr. Braun, seconded by Mr. Dudeck, Mr. Smith was nominated for the position of Vice President. Mr. Smith declined.

Mrs. Doyle questioned how the district would benefit from this Agreement. Ms. Fittipaldi replied that it would give the district exposure and showcase the institution. Mr. Maddaluna felt it was good community relations and confirmed it does not interfere with any school activities. Mr. Smith asked the age of the participants and if

they were local. Ms. Fittipaldi reported they are not local. Mr. Maddaluna responded the ages are high school and adults. Mr. Dudeck asked about the liability to the district. Ms. Fittipaldi communicated the organization provides the district with a Certificate of Insurance and the district is indemnified in the Agreement. Mr. Hyncik asked if there were provisions for concessions in this Agreement. Ms. Fittipaldi said no. Ms. Fittipaldi reported there is language in the Agreement that requires any repairs, restoration and maintenance during the time the organization is using our facility will be the responsibility of the organization. Mr. Smith asked the frequency of use. Ms. Fittipaldi replied they use the fields for two weekends in July.
