Superintendent's Update

- February is Career and Technical Education Awareness month and a number of events are scheduled throughout the State to celebrate the work of Career and Technical Schools and their students.
- On February 20, the Assembly Speaker Prieto and Senate President Sweeney together with Assemblyman Diegnan, held a press conference at the State house to bring attention to Career and Technical Education and the recent partnership the County Vocational schools have forged with the NJ Business and Industry Association (NJBIA). This partnership followed the Harvard Pathways to Prosperity Study, which focused National attention on career and technical education as an educational and economic priority. It pairs employers with educators and enlists the support of policy makers to promote technical education in New Jersey. To date 125 employers have signed on. Thirteen of our own business partners have signed up to be active members in this new coalition.
- On February 27th the House and possibly the Senate will be approving a ceremonial resolution in support of CTE month. We too are hosting some high profile visits from policy makers, to increase their awareness of our programs and learn about our students' success.
- SCESC Career Center - A meeting was held with the SCESC and Shop-Rite staff, to discuss the Supermarket program and the building plan, slated for September 2015. SCESC's contractor/builder has filed for bankruptcy, therefore the SCESC is in the process of engaging another contractor.
- Articulation Agreements - The National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) certification obtained last year has enabled us to partner with the Universal Technology Institute which will provide our students with additional post-secondary options; and the University of Northwestern Ohio has signed an agreement to award AP (college credits) for up to 18 credits, for students currently enrolled in our automotive and diesel programs.
- School Calendar Update – Due to weather conditions, to date, we have closed five days, had four delayed openings, and one early dismissal. We will be adding two additional days to the end of the school year moving graduation to June 24, 2014.

B. 2014-2015 Annual School District Budget

On motion by Mr. Dudeck, seconded by Ms. Brennan, and on roll call vote the Board of Education adopted the 2014-2015 annual school district budget for the General Fund in the amount of \$14,647,316.00 and the Special Revenue Fund of \$899,046.00 for a total of \$15,546,362.00. The proposed budget includes sufficient funds to provide curriculum and instruction which will enable all students to achieve the core Curriculum Content Standards, and is in compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A and N.J.A.C. Title 6 and 6A. As per N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.2(b), the proposed budget provides for a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for travel and expense reimbursement. The 2014-2015 budget includes a maximum travel appropriation of \$69,641.00. The Assistant Superintendent for Business shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded. Included in the 2014-2015 proposed budget is a maximum regular business travel amount of \$1,500.00 per employee. This budget is subject to change based on state aid funding which will be released on Thursday, February 27th. The 2014-15 budget will increase by any additional State aid to support the administration of the online PARCC Assessments and digital learning. Mrs. Strober informed the board that the Executive County Superintendent will need a resolution that has the revised budget amount that includes the additional State aid as discussed.

5111- ELIGIBILITY/ACCEPTANCE OF RESIDENT/NON-RESIDENT PUPILS

5111 ELIGIBILITY/ACCEPTANCE OF RESIDENT/NONRESIDENT PUPILS (M)**M**

The Somerset County Vocational & Technical Schools Board of Education is dedicated to providing an adaptable program in career and technical education and preparing Somerset County secondary school pupils, and out-of-school youth, entrance into an appropriate occupation.

The school shall institute a vigorous program of student recruitment to assure pupil enrollment of a size in keeping with the extent of the school plant and facilities and consistent with countywide demographics. Recruitment shall include:

1. Alerting the administration and staff of middle schools and high schools in the county of the programs and opportunities for pupils offered in the Vocational and Technical High School;
2. Informing parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) and the public about the programs offered;
3. Informing the public, business, industry and non-profit organizations of the various offerings and programs; and
4. Informing students of the district's career and technical program first-hand during school hours at their respective schools through all means of communications, including but not limited to, school assemblies, presentations, etc.

Recruitment literature shall include information for the high school regarding various programs. Recruitment activities shall include working closely with school counselors at middle and high schools in Somerset County, participation in college and career-planning activities, public appearances before community groups, newspaper releases, paid advertising, and exhibits of various types.

All members of the professional staff shall be asked to assist with recruitment under the general leadership of the Superintendent and under specific direction of division administrators and department supervisors and coordinators.

Non-resident pupils are defined as those whose parent(s) and/or legal guardian(s) reside outside the sending school district's catchment area.

All students of Somerset County will be accepted into the district's programs provided that they qualify under the admission criteria, that they pay the required tuition/fees for non-residents, and that there is space in the program or courses for which they apply. *Residents and*

Eligible students must participate in the admission process and meet the acceptance criteria which include consideration of academic progress, standardized test scores, attendance and discipline records, and evidence of a commitment to a particular career program. Students enrolled in the district *Land ability to meet safety and standards* must remain in good standing in order to continue their enrollment.

Nothing in N.J.A.C.6A:22-4.3 or this Policy shall preclude the Board from seeking to identify, through further investigation or periodic requests for current validation of previously determined eligibility status, pupils enrolled in the district who may be ineligible for continued attendance due to error in initial assessment, changed circumstances or newly discovered information.
