New Paint Booth Puts SCYTHS Auto Body Program Ahead of The Class

new and exciting addition has recently been installed into the SCVTHS Auto Body program. At the center of the program, a new paint booth with mixing room has replaced an out of date, inefficient, and sometimes non-functioning booth. With backing from the SCVTHS Auto Body Advisory Committee the new stateof-the-art paint booth was purchased with funding made possible by the Somerset County Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act Grant.

The new booth has been completed with a large focus on increased safety and added health benefits. It includes a cutting-edge ventilation system and air apparatus, which filters in Grade D breathing air through a rotary compressor system so that the students will not breathe in harmful fumes caused by the spray paint. By providing Grade D breathing air, the booth meets all of OSHA's strict safety standards and complements additional safety features such as the fire hazard and cabin pressure systems.

A true quality teaching and learning environment, the booth provides a sizeable increase in learning and

work space. The days of cramped areas where only a few students are able to take part in a lesson at one time are now a thing of the past. Also by having the larger booth, students can now work on larger vehicles, which will increase their skill sets.

SCVTHS Auto Body instructor Mr. George Byrd commented on the new booth by saying, "It's a wonderful thing. The new booth has really moved us into the 21st Century where we should be. By replacing the old unreliable booth, we will get the students to where they need to be."

In addition to the safety features and added space, the

new facility is set up for both waterborne and solvent-based paints. Because the industry is moving towards waterborne paints, it is important for students to learn what they will be using in the industry upon graduation.

"This was something that was needed for the future of the program and teaching students so they are ready for the workplace," Mr. Byrd remarked.*
