One of the many features of the new Life Skills program includes

students utilizing Naviance computer software. The Naviance software helps students to create resumes, take personality assessments, investigate career paths and even see official labor

Another aspect of the Life Skills program, allows students to attend mock interviews with real companies within Somerset County. With the help of GeoPeak Energy in Somerset, students involved in the program reviewed their resumes and participated in mock interviews to sharpen their career readiness skills.

Erick Bowers, Student Advocate at SCVTHS, said the event was, "truly a positive experience." Bowers went on to add that the Life Skills program is multi-phased. "This was the first phase in a Life Skills program. The next phase will be with a manager of a Local a TD Bank and will have students learning how to be financially responsible.
