t. Governor Kim Guadagno recently set out to tour many of New Jersey's Career and Technical Education schools. During her visits around the state Lt. Governor Guadagno included a stop at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School (SCVTHS) to see the Academy for Health & Medical Sciences.

The Academy for Health & Medical Sciences is unlike any other program in the state. The Academy began in 2006, developed around a partnership with Raritan Valley Community College through which the students obtain dual credit throughout their high school careers. Upon graduation, students in the

Academy for Health & Medical Sciences receive both a high school diploma, as well as an Associate's Degree in General Science from Raritan Valley Community College.

Prior to acceptance into the Academy for Health & Medical Sciences Program, students must proceed through an extensive admissions process, which includes a test and interview to ensure that they are qualified and prepared. In addition, students must maintain a 3.0 GPA during their tenure in the rigorous program.

Other dignitaries taking part in the tour with the Lt. Governor on her visit to SCVTHS were New Jersey Commissioner of Labor Harold J. Wirths and Marie Barry, director of the state Department of Education's Office of Career and Technical Education. Administrators joining the Lt. Governor from SCVTHS were Superintendent Dr. Chrys Harttraft, Principal Diane Ziegler, and Supervisor of Academics Teresa Morelli. In addition, Raritan Valley Community College's Joanne Travaglini, Coordinator of Early College and Outreach, and Nancy Jordan, Dean of Academic Programs and Partnerships, also joined the tour.

Dr. Harttraft spoke of the visit stating, "We were honored to be visited by such high-profile public servants who demonstrated their support for vocational and technical education. They shared details of their efforts to increase business opportunities in our State and indicated that their success is

Johanna Scholl Selected as Teacher of the Year at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School

Johanna Scholl, a science instructor at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School, has been selected as the 2013-2014 Teacher of the Year. Ms. Scholl is known for being a hard-working, respected and dedicated instructor, who is committed to improving the entire school community.

When Principal Ziegler broke the news over the loudspeaker Ms. Scholl was in the middle of teaching a class which broke out into cheers. "It was pretty cool," Ms. Scholl explained. She went on to add how she was speechless, surprised, and honored when the announcement was made, adding "I am extremely grateful."

After graduating from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Sciences with a degree in Toxicology, Ms. Scholl worked for a short period of time in the consumer products and environmental engineering industries. Her time in the corporate world did not last long, as she found herself in a position which was lacking the personal interaction she needed.

When asked why she decided to pursue a teaching job, Ms. Scholl explained that she wanted to have a "long term impact on people." She loved the idea of interacting with the students and ultimately chose to pursue teaching high school as it enabled her to teach a higher and more in-depth level of science. One of the more challenging parts of Ms. Scholl's job is that not all students understand the science she teaches on their first attempt. She continually urges students to not give up, and works with each student so that they may achieve understanding in

Ms. Scholl began her career at SCVTHS as a part-time science instructor in the TOPS (Technical Occupational Preparation for Success) alternative program. After 16 years Ms. Scholl claims that patience and a sense of humor are the two most important factors that have contributed to her longevity in the classroom. She commends the students and staff (especially the TOPS faculty) for playing a large role in her continued success.

At SCVTHS, Ms. Scholl serves as the TOPS Memory Book Advisor, is a member of the Whole School Reform Committee, as well as helping to develop the next generation of state-wide core science standards in vocational and technical schools.

Johanna Scholl is a resident of Somerville, where she resides with her husband, Steven. They are the proud parents of three sons. In her spare time, Ms. Scholl enjoys reading, Broadway shows, dining out, shopping, and taking the family dog for walks.
