On June 13th, as part of a Flag Day celebration, the Somerset County Vocational-Technical Education Association dedicated 60 American flags at a ceremony held at Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School.

The classroom flags, purchased by the SCVTEA, were dedicated by Edward V. Danberry, who served in the United States Army as a Spec Five from 1967-1969 with the 2/67th Armored Division based at Ft. Hood, Texas and is a disabled veteran. Mr. Danberry spoke of how the teachers at SCVTHS were not only teaching core subjects, but also teaching values and patriotism. Joining Mr. Danberry at the ceremony were five other local veterans from different divisions of the Army and Marines, including a

Purple Heart recipient and two current Somerset County Sheriff's Officers.

During the dedication, Mr. Danberry explained to the crowd the significance of the colors which make up the flags of the United States and New Jersey and went into detail on their history.

So pleased with how the SCVTEA had donated the classroom flags, Mr. Danberry had a surprise gift, which was a State of New Jersey flag to be flown outside SCVTHS along with the school's American flag.

Also during the ceremony, the winner of the school's Flag Day poster contest was announced. Jaqueline Gassler of Branchburg, a sophomore in the Graphic Communications program at SCVTHS, won a certificate and \$100 Visa gift card for placing first in the contest.\*
