According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) website, "The AgDiscovery Program was initiated as an APHIS Veterinary Services Pilot Program in 2002. This year, we have a total of 20 universities hosting an AgDiscovery Program on college campuses nationwide. Funding for AgDiscovery is enabled through cooperative agreements between APHIS and the host universities."

"AgDiscovery is a summer camp outreach program to help middle through high school aged students explore careers in animal science, veterinary medicine,

agribusiness, plant pathology, aquaculture, and much more. This 2-4 week program allows participants to live on a college campus and learn about agricultural science from university professors, practicing veterinarians, industry representatives, and professionals working for the U.S. government. Students who participate in AgDiscovery gain experience through hands-on labs, workshops, field trips and other group and team building activities."
