On April 6, 2016, a group of United States veterans, Somerset County Freeholders, as well as Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School students and staff came together to witness a ceremony as a piece of the USS Arizona battleship was donated by the United States Navy. The USS Arizona is known for being one of the battleships which sank in Honolulu, Hawaii during the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.

The dedication began with the singing of the Star Spangled Banner by Khailah Johnson of Somerset, a junior in the Somerset County Vocational & Technical High School's Gifted and Talented Honors Theater Arts Program. Social Studies Instructor & Army Veteran Ed M. Graf, who organized and led the event, spoke to the crowd

saying that by giving us a piece of the USS Arizona, this was "one of the greatest honors which could be bestowed upon our school."

After Mr. Graf's address, United States Navy Machinist Mate 1st Class Larsen presented the piece of the ship along with a certificate and letter. Machinist Mate 1st Class Larsen went on to describe the attack on Pearl Harbor, and how the USS Arizona played a part in that attack. During his address, Machinist Mate 1st Class Larsen said, "With this dedication today, we are helping to ensure that the memory of the sacrifice will not be lost for future generations and that each and every student who walks by this mantle will know and be thankful for the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice, so that they can learn and study in a free America."
